Impact:

- Quality of teaching which is good or better remains 100% good + with some outstanding teaching.
- English training has equipped teachers with the skills to engage and enhance the learning experience for all
 children. Following on from a successful and extremely engaging literacy scheme with a Refugee theme, a Pathways
 to Write literacy planning scheme has been purchased from the Literacy Company for the academic year 20192020.
- Oxford Reading Tree books have been bought to develop children's reading skills.
- Maths training has introduced Maths: No Problem; a programme of maths learning which is approved by the DfE. Its aim is to develop children's fluency, reasoning and problem solving skills in maths. It is based on international research into effective teaching of maths. All teachers are using the Maths: No Problem approach in lessons and overall, it is impacting positively on the children's learning.
- Recourses to support Maths: No Problem have been purchased. Teachers have resources to support children working below expected standards in maths.
- Opportunities for visits have enriched the curriculum and life experience of PP children. For example, a visit to the Liverpool Philharmonic Hall, a trip to the Brindley theatre, Crucial crew life skills for Y5, health training for KS1 and KS2 and a professional basketball player coming to school to teach skills to the children.



- Vulnerable children and those who are SEND/PP are well supported through small group interventions and 1:1 mentoring sessions.
- Children who experience Speech and Language difficulties have small group or 1:1 intervention to develop their pronunciation, expressive and receptive language.
- Children with SEND are given the support they need to make progress at their own pace, through assessment, support, group intervention and 1:1 sessions.
- Children in early years are supported through CPD of staff, who have undertaken a wide range training to achieve GLD.
