

Will you get onto our leader board after the holidays?


Practise makes perfect!

Two members of our School Council were delighted to receive our award in recognition of all the hard work the school has done this year to promote and support mental and physical health and wellbeing.



In History, we have been learning about the Romans and how they changed Britain.

Uniform:

Please remember that our outdoor activities / PE kit is navy blue. Once again, we have seen an increase in the number of children wearing bright colours / prints / pictures / logos which does not meet our dress code. Trainers must only be worn for PE and not as an alternative to school shoes. With the exception of small stud earrings, jewellery should not be worn. Long hair must be tied up for safety.





This continues to be an issue at either end of the school day. However, the situation is made worse by regular incidents of rude and aggressive behaviour from parents and carers, usually in front of children. **Dropping off** or **parking on the zigzags** is prohibited, as is parking across the crossing areas. Several cars are in the habit of pulling up outside the car park gates - this is still a no park zone and blocks the path. Please be mindful and courteous of how you park to enable as many people as possible to park safely around you.

Attendance across school still improving. During the summer term however, we have had an unprecedented number of holidays in term time. This remains a key judgement indicator for Ofsted. Holidays in term time: The decision of not authorising any 'holidays' and any subsequent fines is not led by school but is a Government stipulation, which school's must adhere to and administer. Remember though, if your child is ill, please do not send them into school.

<u>Punctuality:</u> Thanks to all families who have been signing your children in at the office when the school gates have closed at 8.50am. Remember that you can drop off from 8.40am as teachers already have learning activities set up from this time and teaching begins at 8.50am. Phonics begins daily at 9am. If children arrive after 8.50am they are missing valuable learning time.
