

<u>Attendance and Punctuality</u>: Please be aware that we will continue to closely monitor both attendance and punctuality. Letters keeping you up to date with your child's attendance will be sent home every half term. Remember that the minimum expectation set by the Government is 97%. Holiday's in term time will continue to be unauthorised as per Government guidance.

Late after the gate is locked: A reminder...now that our entrance is completed, all children being dropped off late must be signed in by an adult inside school. This is to comply with our safeguarding arrangements. Please do not put our office staff in the difficult position of having to call you in. Thanks. Green, amber and red letters will be sent home this week to keep you up to date with your child's attendance. Parking

Regretfully, parking in and around school continues to be an issue and it would seem to be getting worse. There is an increased lack of consideration for other road users, pedestrians and neighbours. Can we remind you that...

It is unlawful to drop off on the zig-zag lines, this includes pulling up and not specifically stopping.

White road markings indicate not to park on the raised speed hump.

Road marking indicate not to park across the designated crossing points near to the railings.

Please do not use the entrance to the car park as a layby or turning circle as this is a danger to pedestrians.

Do not block resident's driveways.

Please do not use bad language in front of other people's children - your number plates are always shared!

<u>**Read**</u>, <u>Write Inc</u> – <u>Phonics</u>: School has invested heavily in our new phonics scheme, and we are really pleased with its positive results and the impact on reading.
